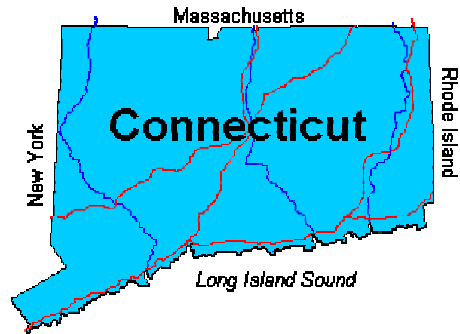

*Opened in 1995, the Coastal Center is located on an 8.4-acre barrier beach known as the Smith-Hubbell Wildlife Refuge that is situated next to the 840-acre Wheeler Wildlife Management Area (a salt marsh) at the mouth of the Housatonic River. These diverse and interactive environments of salt water, tidal marsh and fresh water create rich*

*habitats which abound in plant and animal communities that are ideal for observation and study.*

*Center features include: educational exhibits, a tide pool demonstration tank, a salt-marsh laboratory, the Smith-Hubbell Wildlife Refuge and Bird Sanctuary, a boardwalk and observation platform with interpretive signage, 70ft covered observation tower for panoramic vistas, classes, lectures and workshops related to environmental topics for all experience levels, adult lecture series and interpretive bird and nature walks led by naturalists.*

*Dinosaur Crossing is 60 acres of outdoor exploration and discovery adjacent to Nature's Art. One and a half miles of nature trails winding through pristine woodlands provide the perfect prehistoric backdrop for 21 life-like and life-sized dinosaur recreations – from the 40 foot-tall Brachiosaurus welcoming guests at the beginning of the trail to the tiny two-foot-tall Compsognathus hiding in the laurels.*

*Billed as "New England's version of Jurassic Park" by Family Fun Magazine, the Park includes various trails including the **Mesozoic Trail** (featuring a variety of dinosaurs from that era, 225 to 66 million years ago, including Protoceratops and Parasaurolophus), the **Connecticut Trail** (showcasing creatures that roamed through our state approximately 230 to 185 million years ago, including Anchisaurus and Dilophosaurus), and the **Raptor Bay Trail**: offering a beautiful walk along a seven-acre lake that is perfect for viewing abundant wildlife, the new volcano and even two raptors!). The facility also includes touch and learn stations, a nine-ton volcano, "Space Nets," and more!*

Surrounding the Exhibit Center are more than two miles of nature trails and the Dinosaur State Park Arboretum, containing more than 250 species and cultivars of conifers, as well as katsuras, ginkgoes, magnolias and other living representatives of plant families which appeared in the Age of Dinosaurs.*
