The **UConn@COP Program** strives to build future leaders in climate science and policy and to promote UConn's leadership on solutions to these existential challenges through four main pillars:

- 1. Student Engagement**
- 2. Experiential Learning**
- 3. Interdisciplinary Group Discussion**
- 4. Cultural Immersion**

Each year since 2015, UConn selects high-achieving students to participate in the annual **UN Climate Summit and Conference of the Parties (COP)**. During our week at the COP, we observe delegates from 195 nations in formal proceedings and negotiations, and we join tens of

thousands of stakeholders from around the world at related workshops, presentations, exhibits and side events focused on preventing, and building resilience to, the increasing effects of global warming. The UConn contingent also engages in lively group discussions, takes impactful cultural/historical excursions, hosts a networking event and shares their experiences through blogs and social media. 
